

April Gather Block Party Triangles ...

March: Nine-Patch


For each block use darks lights & a pop of color fabric



triangles.



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


Two methods to make wonky triangles


Paper pieced








Create your template And sew



Improv: arbitrarily cut two squares, both facing up, into 3 pieces Swap the middle pieces (or any other of the pieces) Sew the pieces of each set together to make 2 mis-shaped squares.





Audition how the two triangles will look when pieced together by folding one back along a straight edge on the diagonal.



When you decide how you want the two triangles to look, place them together, right sides together, and draw a diagonal line. Sew 1/4" from the line, and cut on the line.


Press each wonky square open.







Trim each square and continue or stop, depending on the size block you wish to make.




